Foundation Announces First Round of Human Services Grants

Cincinnati, OH—The Carol Ann and Ralph V. Haile, Jr./U.S. Bank Foundation announces that \$117,500 has been awarded to eight organizations in its first cycle of Human Services grants. The Foundation recognizes a responsibility to help ensure that basic human needs, such as shelter, sustenance and social services, are provided throughout the region. In the field of human services, the Foundation has a particular focus on these needs and on assisting families and individuals achieve economic and financial stability.

The field of Human Services is the only area in which the Foundation solicits grant requests through a competitive application process administered by The Greater Cincinnati Foundation. Twenty eight agencies completed a letter of intent, expressing an interest in seeking funds, of which nineteen applied by the June 15, 2009 deadline.

Organizations that will benefit from the Haile Foundation are:

Beech Acres Parenting Center

\$20,000 grant to support its parent coaching program for achieving economic stability

Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Cincinnati, Inc.

\$20,000 grant to support the agency's food program

Childhood Food Solutions

\$17,500 grant to provide food to children using neighborhood delivery

CWFF Child Development Center

\$7,500 grant to provide free childcare services to families that are homeless

Interfaith Hospitality Network of Northern Kentucky

\$10,000 grant toward operating costs of the Day Center serving families that are homeless

Northern Kentucky Community Action Commission

\$15,000 grant toward operating costs of its Neighborhood Centers that help families achieve economic stability

Santa Maria Community Services

\$20,000 grant to support its affordable housing programs
